

Ayo!'s Emergency Campaign to Support Families of Artsakh

Fund for Armenian Relief (FAR)
has launched a new campaign
that will urgently source and
deliver food and hygiene
supplies, school supplies, winter
clothing, bedding, and
medication to the people of
Artsakh who have had
to flee their homes.

Speak up and urge the United States to stand with the people of Armenia and Artsakh and please continue to make calls to local, state, and federal government officials by doing the following:

Urge your U.S. Senators to support S. Res. 754 and S. Res. 755 holding Turkey and Azerbaijan accountable over their human rights abuses against the people of Artsakh. To stop the torture of Armenian captives, forcefully condemn Azerbaijani abuses, and to call for the immediate release of all Armenians held by Azerbaijani forces (an agreed-upon provision of the cease-fire). The U.S. should pursue justice for any and all crimes of war committed against Armenian civilians and soldiers.

Contact Robert Destro, Assistant Secretary of State for Human Rights; James Gilmore, U.S. Ambassador for the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe; and Andrew Schofer, the U.S. Co-Chair of the OSCE Minsk Group, for a detailed report on the full scope and details of U.S. government information regarding abuses committed against Armenians during and after Azerbaijani's aggression.

Reach out to the International Committee of the Red Cross regarding the immediate release of all Armenians held captive by Azerbaijani forces. The Human Rights Ombudsmen of both Armenia and Artsakh (Nagorno Karabakh) have reported that Baku is not honoring this term of its cease-fire agreement.

Ask leaders to pass a U.S. emergency humanitarian aid package of a least \$250 million to provide desperately needed care for those so terribly abused in Azerbaijani captivity.

Ask leaders to support the Independence of the Artsakh Republic.

Ask leaders to sanction the Aliyev/Erdogan regimes for war crimes.



HUMANITARIAN AID FOR ARTSAKH / ARMENIA

Message from the Parish Council

Like every other church community, we have continued to struggle with the pandemic since the spring. St. Peter Armenian Church, under the capable leadership of Fr. Stepanos, and with the guidance and collaboration of Bishop Daniel Findikyan, has been able to move forward while operating in a whole new way. While working to prevent the spread of infection, we have attempted to provide activities, services, educational opportunities, and spiritual support to our parishioners. Fortunately, the online Zoom platform has given us a way to stay in touch and to stay informed as we continue to move forward under these unusual circumstances.

The Diocese has been diligent in its efforts to protect and inform our members, recommending precautionary measures along the way, and providing support and guidance. Through the use of frequent Zoom meetings, Bishop Daniel has maintained constant communication and relayed relevant information and guidance. Fr. Stepanos has been in constant communication with the Diocese and other parishes throughout this entire period, exchanging information, brainstorming solutions, and providing ongoing support.

Although we were forced to curtail Sunday Badarak early in the year, Fr. Stepanos, with the assistance of the Parish Council, worked diligently to come up with a solution. Fortunately, we were able to conduct Sunday Services in the Postoian Pavilion for all who chose to attend throughout the summer months. The outdoor environment and socially-distant seating made it possible to feel safe while attending and participating in Sunday worship services. As the summer faded, we continued to take advantage of the mild weather well into September and October, offering outdoor services until mid-October. At that time, Fr. Stepanos and the Parish Council regrouped and discussed the preparations needed to resume conducting services in the sanctuary, while taking all necessary health and safety precautions.

Throughout all of the planning during these very extraordinary circumstances, the maintenance of the church building was still required. A summary of the recent projects of repair and maintenance were undertaken by the Building Committee of the Parish Council include the following:

Roof Repair: Due to several torrential rainstorms resulting in a number of leaks inside the church, the roof was sorely in need of repair. A contractor was selected and the work was completed this spring.

Sanctuary Ceiling & Entrance Doors Repairs: Due in part to the roof issues, the sanctuary ceiling was peeling in some areas and was in need of sanding and repainting. These repairs were performed by Sage Brothers Painting Company. Shortly afterward, Sage Brothers also refinished the two side emergency exit doors of the church as well as refinishing the two front main entrance doors.

Boiler Repair: It has been necessary to have the boilers repaired and parts replaced several times in recent years. It may become necessary to think about replacing them in the not-too-distant future.

Security / Surveillance: Another area the Parish Council is currently investigating is the safety and security of the church and grounds. Right now, we are soliciting and evaluating quotes for a comprehensive surveillance system to better protect the church property and to have visual access to the front of the property from the rear lower level offices.

With the need to cancel our traditional Annual Armenian Festival due to the pandemic, event co-chairs, Yn. Paulette Doudoukjian and Chuck Tutunjian, gave the "Festival" a whole new meaning this year by organizing a series of Friday night drive-thru dinners throughout the month of June. This effort was so successful, they took on two more Friday night drive-thru dinners in the month of October. This very creative endeavor

September 27 Sunday School Lemonade Project: "Making Lemonade Out of Lemons"


RECIPE:

Stir all ingredients in a large pitcher with mixing spoon.




Sunday School

After careful consideration with the ongoing pandemic, the St. Peter Armenian Church Sunday School started classes for the new school year through Zoom on September 27.

Classes meet regularly on Sunday evenings starting at 5:30 p.m. with the **Little Faithfuls Group** led by Fr. Stepanos and Mrs. Holly Dadekian. This class is open to all infants and toddlers through first grade students and their parents/grandparents.

At 6:00 p.m., Fr. Stepanos then offers a brief 15-minute assembly for **ALL Sunday School students.** The first assembly on September 27 was about how to make lemonade out of lemons — figuratively and literally. Der Hayr demonstrated that, if we were to eat the lemon alone, it is sour and may taste bad, but if we add water and sugar, it will taste good. He highlighted the point that something good can come out of something bad.



I meet with the **2nd to 5th grade** classes at 6:15 p.m. We have been discussing how everything comes from God. We talked about the story of creation — how God created us and our world and how He provided everything that we need to live.

The 6th to 9th grade students meet at 6:45 p.m. with Sean McMullan. This class has been studying the Old Testament stories and the lessons they teach us, such as the story of Adam & Eve that show that people have been making mistakes since the beginning of time, yet God is merciful and forgiving. Noah and the Ark taught that people

don't always listen to the warnings from God, but He still loves us. David and Goliath teaches us that we may face big problems, but with God's help, we can overcome them. As the Christmas season approaches, the class will transition into the New Testament and the teachings of Jesus to see how those stories relate to our lives today and how they are different or similar to the lessons of the Old Testament.

Chuck Tutunjian helped our **2020 graduates** prepare for their final exam in November; after which he will meet regularly with **10th and 11th grade** students.

NO classes are held on the Sunday of the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays.

Moving with Maria

Maria Derian continues to offer her *Moving with Maria* exercise class via Zoom. Recently reaching a milestone of 200 classes, Maria is thankful to God for having the chance to offer this online class. Special thanks to Yn. Paulette Doudoukjian for recommending the virtual class. Classes have been expanded to include a morning and afternoon schedule with several recorded sessions as well as live instruction.

One-hour live sessions are available Monday-Friday at 10:30am. Maria starts by leading the class in the Hayr Mer (Lord's Prayer) and offers a prayer to God to protect the Motherland, to take care of those who are sick, and for God to answer the prayers of all who seek Him. The class then begins with typically 8-10 participants on most mornings who are informed of the "step count" at the end of each class.

Maria has recorded five different workouts for the afternoon sessions available primarily on Monday-Thursday at 4:30pm. (You just might see Maria joining her own recorded class.)

Since starting in March, Maria is noticing that the (regular) participants are in better physical shape and have a more positive attitude. Consider joining in at any time, no matter your current fitness level. Maria encourages each participant to do what they can — "As long as you are moving and having fun, that's what we care about." Follow along the best you can or modify however you need. Maria's goal is to help individuals get in better shape while having fun and enjoying seeing one another. Don't hesitate, join the "Hye Family Fitness Ladies" at any time!

All are welcome to try as new participants are always welcome. You set your own schedule and pace; participate every day or just two or three times a week. Something is better than nothing! Participants are not just from the St. Peter Church community. In addition to friends from the Capital District, we have friends from New Jersey and other areas as well who have become very close friends that motivate and look after each other.

There is no charge for these classes; however, Maria asks that participants consider a donation to "St. Peter Armenian Church." This brings the total amount of donations from Moving with Maria participants to \$2,215.

BLESSING OF GRAPES SERVICES

On Sunday, August 16, the traditional Blessing of the Grapes Service was conducted following worship services. This service is peculiar to the Armenian Church and originated in the ancient Hebrew custom of celebrating the first fruits of the harvest. After the adoption of Christianity, the celebration assumed a new meaning with symbolic religious significance.

The grape wine used in Holy Communion, after it is consecrated, becomes the blood of Christ which was shed on the Cross for our salvation. Also, as grapes are propagated by their vine, not by seeds, so was our Lord conceived without human seed by the power of the Holy Spirit. Thus, the Blessing of the Grapes Service has become a special religious ceremony in which we ask the Holy Spirit to make the grapes holy, and for those who eat them in faith to receive physical healing and spiritual nourishment.

Exaltation of the Holy Cross, September 13

On Sunday, September 13, the Armenian Church celebrated one of its Tabernacle (Daghavar) Feasts, the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. When the true Cross of Christ was discovered in Jerusalem in 326 A.D., it was housed in the Basilica and took the Cross back to Persia as a token of their victory. In 628 A.D. the Byzantine Emperor Heraclius (who was of Armenian origin) defeated the Persians and returned the Holy Cross to Jerusalem. The "Exaltation of the Holy Cross" denotes its elevation or lifting up as a sign of victory of the Christian faith, for the Cross of Christ will be victorious in the end and will conquer all evil.



In the Armenian Church the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross includes the ritual of the Procession and Blessing of the Four Corners of the Earth. The order of "Antasdan" took place following the morning service. The Holy Cross will be decorated with sweet basil, an herb that ripens at this time of the year and is considered a royal spice. The word basil in Greek means king, and so it embellishes the Cross of the King. At the end of the Divine Liturgy, the congregation is invited to come forward to venerate the Cross and take sprigs of basil home with them as tokens of Christ's victory.


