

The year 2021 marks the 50th anniversary of the consecration of the St. Peter Armenian Church in Watervliet. This year also marks the 25th anniversary of the ordination of Fr. Stepanos Doudoukjian to the Priesthood at St. Peter Armenian Church.



On September 29, 1971 over 500 were in attendance for the consecration of the new church on the hill in Watervliet. Primate of the Eastern Diocese of the Armenian Church of America at the time, Most Rev. Archbishop Torkom Manoogian,

Church of America at the time, Most Rev. Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, officiated at the ceremonies assisted by former St. Peter Church pastors, Rt. Rev. Papken Varjabedian and Rev. Fr. Garen Gdanian, all of blessed memory.



Deacon Gregory Doudoukjian started with St. Peter Armenian Church as deacon-in-charge in November 1995. On February 10-11, 1996, Deacon Gregory was ordained and consecrated to the holy order of the priesthood of the Armenian Church by then Primate of the Eastern Diocese, Archbishop Khajag Barsamian. At the consecration service, Deacon Gregory was given the new name — Fr. Stepanos.

The name "Stepanos" was respectfully requested by Dn. Gregory in memory of his twin brother, Stephen, who passed away as an infant; it is also the name of the first Christian martyr and deacon.

Friday Flavors: Feasts & Festivities



Upon the request of the Parish Council, again this year a series of Friday Flavors of Armenia drive-thru meals were held in May and early June in lieu of the annual Armenian Festival.

Armenia Delicious Chicken Kebab and Hye Burger dinners, complete with pilaf and Armenian slaw, were served each week with optional ala carte items

of lahmejune, cheese beoreg, eech, and hummus. Of course, delicious Armenian dessert of paklava and cream kadayef were also available for purchase — as well as paklava ice cream sundaes on the final week.

Customers ordered online or in-person in the safe, contact-free, drive-thru process. However, as state and local COVID restrictions eased up, people were allowed to sit under the Postoian Pavilion to eat and enjoy each other's company on the last Friday, June 4. On that week also, a special Armenian dance performance was presented by Maria Derian, Violet Mirzoyan, and Nayiri Tournayan.

A 50/50 Raffle was also organized for the final Friday Flavors week on June 4 raising \$955 in tickets sales. The first place winner of half the total ticket sales was Ron Kaiser. We thank Ron for donating a portion of his winnings back to the church. The second place winner of a gift bag of many of the frozen food items available during the drive-thrus went to Elena Baugh Bukda.

Message from Parish Council



New Security Surveillance System Installed: The installation of a new surveillance system was completed in June by a local Watervliet company, Imperial Security Systems, Inc. The system includes nine camera views around the perimeter of the property which record any and all detected motion. These recordings are stored on a back-up system for up to two or three months, depending on the amount of movement/recordings. Viewing monitors have been installed in the church office as well as the priest's office, giving viewing access to all areas of the grounds. Live and recorded footage can be viewed remotely with a phone application as well. As an added deterrent, new signage will be mounted warning all who enter the property that a surveillance system is in use. The goal is to have the ability to keep a watchful eye on our beautiful property, deter those who may have mischief in mind, identify anyone who causes damage or abuses our property, and enjoy more peace of mind.

Entryway Project: A committee has been formed to research architectural ideas to renovate the front entrance area of the church. Bob Bedian and Chuck Tutunjian, along with Fr. Stepanos and other Parish Council members, have met with a couple of firms and decided to retain Wallant Architecture to design a preliminary schematic design. Once complete and agreeable to the committee, this design will be presented to the parish along with estimated construction costs. A project of this magnitude will require a passing vote from dues-paying members during a special parish assembly. Details on this project will be provided as they evolve.



Organic Ministry Project: If you've driven around to the back entrance of the church lately, you may have noticed that a small garden has sprouted up. I, with the help of Jonah Doudoukjian and Catherine Knauer, planted a variety of vegetables and herbs as a small community "Organic Ministry" project. We welcome those who have the time and interest to assist with this project with weeding, watering, and, at some point, harvesting our small crop. Bring your children to watch them grow, let them help by watering the garden (a hose is located directly across the driveway from the garden). Hopefully, in the near future we may enjoy the "fruits of our labors" at a fellowship hour or luncheon event at the church. 





Special Donations

Armenian Church Endowment Fund (ACEF)

FINANCIAL GUIDELINES for Endowments

Definition

Endowments are funds or property donated to St. Peter Armenian Church. The income from the endowments shall be used as follows:

Special Purpose Funds

(Restricted endowments)

Funds or property donated for a specific purpose or use defined by the donor in cooperation with the Parish Council. Such purposes may include: scholarship, educational experience, or a specifically funded program.

Special Considerations: Any Special Purpose Fund shall require a minimum of \$2,500 and the approval of Parish Council. Additions to the fund may be made at any time. No subsidiary organization for the Church may establish or contribute to a Special Purpose Fund.

Permanent Funds

(Unrestricted endowments)

Funds or property donated without any specific purpose or use identified by the donor. The income from these endowments may be used for general operating expenses or as designated by the Parish Council.

Special Considerations: Any Permanent Fund shall require a minimum of \$1,000 as an initial principal. All interest generated from the Permanent Fund shall be transferred annually to the General Fund. We recently received our annual distribution check from the ACEF for the year 2020. Most of the distribution is from endowments established with St. Peter Armenian Apostolic Church, but managed by the ACEF. Additionally, some of the distribution is received from endowments established by individuals directly with the ACEF, with the Church as the beneficiary of the income distribution.

Distribution for the year 2020 received in 2021 from the ACEF for Church endowments amounted to \$49,354.37 plus \$1,710.35 from direct endowments for a total of \$51,064.72. This amount was reduced by transfers, in accordance with provisions of special purpose funds, totaling \$2,579.79 and reinvestments of \$1,409.48, resulting in a net endowment income of \$47.075.45.

No new endowments were established in 2020. Additional amounts were added in 2020 to existing endowments in the names of *Kenneth Chorbajian*, *Leo & Rosine Kazanjian*, *Alice & Paul Moroukian*, and *Toros Shamlian*. Total additions in 2020 for existing endowments was \$28,050.00.

Additions to existing funds can be made at any time during the year. If interested in establishing an endowment fund, please contact the St. Peter Church office.



BLESSING OF GRAPES SERVICES Sunday, August 15




