## 12 Vocations Banquet

The booklet included messages and greetings from Karekin II, Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, Bishop Daniel Findikyan, Primate, Eastern Diocese of the Armenian Church of America, Archbishop Hovnan Derderian, Primate, Western Diocese of the Armenian Church of America, Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, Pontifical Legate of the Armenian Church in Western Europe, as well as Fr. Mardiros Chevian, Dean of St. Nersess Armenian Seminary. Biographical backgrounds as well as messages from each of the 12 honored priests were highlighted in the booklet.

"Six decades ago, the notion of founding an Armenian Church seminary far from the homeland in the United States was considered naïve at best, foolhardy at worst. Today, Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan's foresight has been amply demonstrated by the seminary's abundant fruits: bishops, priests, and deacons trained at St. Nersess tirelessly serve the Armenian Church throughout the world, as lay men and women spiritually reared at the seminary care for God's people through a multitude of Christian ministries. Veterans of the seminary's pioneering youth programs, diverse educational offerings, and spiritual retreats are now the life-blood of our parishes."

During his interview for a special video presentation that was prepared, Fr. Stepanos remarked on his ministry at St. Peter Armenian Church. They're loving people, they're caring people, they're compassionate people, and they've inspired me to do my ministry here. There's no greater joy for me as a priest than to walk with my people in their life journey."







# Yughakin: What does it mean?



It is customary in the Armenian Church to provide Yughakin especially around the feasts of Christmas and Easter. This practice dates as far back as the time of Moses in the Old Testament. Yughakin in Armenian means "price of oil" ~ "Yugh" meaning oil and "kin" meaning price. 

# FROM THE LIFE OF FR. GAREN GDANIAN

February 1, 1925: Born in Aleppo, Syria, to Kevork and Siranoosh (Tavookjian) Gdanian, with a Baptismal name of Sarkis.

1930-1938: Educated in Aleppo Armenian School System.

1938-1944: Studied and was graduated from Jerusalem Seminary

1944-1945: Taught in Zavarian Armenian School, Aleppo, Syria

1945-1947: Studied and was graduated from Antelias Seminary, Beirut, Lebanon

September 1947: Came to the United States by invitation of The Most Rev. Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan.

1947-1950: Studied and received his Bachelor of Divinity Degree from the Episcopal Theological Seminary in Cambridge, Mass.

December 19, 1948: Was ordained a priest by The Most Rev. Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan at St. Vartanantz Armenian Church of Lowell, Mass.

1948-1957: Served at the above parish.

August 27, 1952: Married to former Isabelle Kludjian and went on to have three children, two daughters and one son.

1957-1967: Served as a member of the Diocesan Council for Religious Education of New York City.

1957-1970: Served as the Pastor of St. Gregory the Illuminator Armenian Church, New York City.

August 31, 1964: Received permission by His Holiness, Vasken I, to wear a Pectoral Cross.

September 1970: Elected as the Pastor of St. Peter Armenian Church

of Watervliet, New York.

1971-1975: Served as member of the Diocesan Council, New York City.

1977: Received floral *Pilon* (Phelonion—Cope).

1984: Elevated to the rank of *Avak Kahana* (Senior Priest).

September 1989: Retired but continued to serve when and where needed.

June 27, 2013: Entered his eternal rest.
