PRAYERS FOR OUR PRIMATE

On Saturday, July 16, our Primate of the Eastern Diocese, Very Rev. Fr. Mesrop Parsamyan, was seriously injured in an automobile accident while traveling to St. Vartan Camp. He is at Albany Medical Center and has undergone several surgeries to his hip and ankles. He has a long road of recovery ahead of him and will need continued prayers. He will remain at Albany Med until it is appropriate and safe to transfer him to New York City for continued care and rehabilitation.



Fr. Mesrop expressed his personal thanks to all the caring physicians and nurses at Albany Medical Center and the numerous Armenian doctors and nurses from the region who have looked in on him as well as many others from around the country who have contacted the Diocese offering their counsel, including members of the Armenian American Health Professionals Organization (AAHPO). Fr. Mesrop also expressed his appreciation to Fr. Stepanos and to the St. Peter Armenian Church Parish Council and parishioners for their extended support during this difficult time. He is appreciative of all the prayers and the outreach of our community.

His Holiness Karekin II made a brief visit to the Eastern Diocese (July 18-29) and made a point to visit Fr. Mesrop in the hospital numerous times as well as a brief visit to St. Vartan Camp. There were no public events scheduled for the Catholicos' visit. He held several meetings with leaders of the Diocese and Armenian Organizations.

The Matthew Activity based on Matthew 25:14-30

Question: How do you get 43 Armenians to agree on the same thing? Answer: The Matthew Activity

Fr. Stepanos teased parishioners for weeks about a mystery event that all were invited to attend. He said, "The more who attend the event, the more enriching and fulfilling it will be!" In the mailing announcing the event, was a dollar coin, and all were encouraged to bring it to the event. In total, 330 letters with \$330.00 worth of dollar coins were mailed out to our local parish mailing list. Then, on Sunday, May 15, 43 curious parishioners and Der Hayr met under the Postoian Pavilion for the unveiling of the secret activity.



The event began by Der Hayr pointing out that he had arranged the folding chairs into eight circles of five or six chairs. Then, he told the story (Matthew 25: 14-30) of a man who gave coins to each of his three servants; to one he gave five coins, to another two coins, and to the last one coin. The first two invested and multiplied the money. The third buried the coin given to him. The master was pleased with the first two servants, saying to each, "Well done, good and faithful servant." To the third, he expressed his disappointment: "Thou wicked and slothful servant." The meaning of the parable is that we, as children of God, must prepare ourselves for the Kingdom of God. We prepare by having faith and then putting that faith into action by being stewards of our time, talents, and treasure.



The challenge for the group of 43 was to decide on a single organization to receive a charitable donation (the value of the coins distributed to the parish and more). This was not an easy task.

Kickoff round: Each of the eight groups had five minutes to agree on a charity. Each member within each group made a pitch for their charity of choice and discussions took place. Charities included St. Jude Children's Hospital, Armenian charities, Bethesda House

and other homeless shelters, Alzheimer's, Senior Centers, and our parish's HIMA Home in Armenia. All worthy choices. At the end of five minutes, each of the eight groups were successful, through discussion and consideration, at reaching a consensus on one charity. So, after round one, the group as a whole went from 43 worthy causes to eight.

Round two: Each group joined an adjacent group to form four groups to discuss and consider each other's first round selection. The goal again was for each group to emerge with a single chosen cause. After ten minutes, each group reached consensus and the number of charities in contention was reduced to four.

Round three: The groups again merged, this time into two groups, and a new discussion ensued to choose one cause per group. After fifteen minutes, the number of causes was reduced to two.

The final round: Now it was time to merge into one group of all 43 to pitch and consider the final two charitable causes. Passionate appeals were made for children's hospitals, which was originally proposed by Kevin Kayayan, and HIMA Home, a shelter for girls and young women in Armenia, originally proposed by Sonya Moroukian and later advocated by Guy Vozzy. Then anonymous (eyes closed and show of hands) voting took place. The winner? **HIMA Home!** Within an hour of incremental discussions, the 43 participants selected the charity of choice to receive the donation. *(See the following page for information on this very important project and consider your five-year pledge or one-time donation.)*

The success of this endeavor demonstrated that through passion, consideration, discussion, mutual respect, and consensus building, harmony of thought can be achieved. It also demonstrated how we as a community can prayerfully put our money and talents together and make an impact in other people's lives.

The Matthew Activity is not over! YOU can still be a part of the St. Peter parish team as we raise money for the HIMA Home, an endeavor that was conceived from our parish trip to Armenia in 2019, and spearheaded by Sarine Moroukian. Please send back your dollar coin, as well as any additional donation so we can multiply our talent to help the less fortunate in Armenia. To date, an additional \$1,400 has been generated from The Matthew Activity for the HIMA Home project.





Here are a few Armenian words and phrases for your trip to the doctor. In Armenian, many words are derived from verbs or combined with another word to make a new one.

POOJEL (Fnidtl) means to heal. Derived from POOJEL, the more commonly used word is **PJEESHG** ($pdh_2 u$), which means Doctor. When a word is familiar to you, like **TEGH** ($\eta t \eta$), which means medication, then a **TEGHARAN** ($\eta t \eta u \mu u u$) will be the pharmacy; **TEGHAKORDZ** ($\eta t \eta u \eta n \eta \delta$) will be the pharmacist, and **TEGHAHAD** ($\eta t \eta u h u u$) will be the pill.

Here are a few useful sentences :

PJEESHG, KLOOKHS GEH TZAVEE (Doctor, my head hurts.) TEGH MEH GOOZEM VOR LAVANAM (I need a medication to get better.) HEEVANT EM, HEEVANTANOTZ GERTAM (I am ill, I am going to the hospital.) ANTZADZ TOGH ELLA, PAREE ABAKEENOOM (Let it be a passing, I wish you a good recovery.)

Matthew 6:19-34

19 "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal, 20 but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. 21 For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

22 "The eye is the lamp of the body. So if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light, 23 but if your eye is unhealthy, your whole body will be full of darkness. If, then, the light in you is darkness, how great is the darkness!

24 "No one can serve two masters, for a slave will either hate the one and love the other or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.

25 "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing? 26 Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? 27 And which of you by worrying can add a single hour to your span of life? 28 And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, 29 yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. 30 But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? 31 Therefore do not worry, saying, What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or What will we wear?' 32 For it is the gentiles who seek all these things, and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. 33 But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

34 "So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today.

In the Armenian Church, the word hunphniph (khorhoort) is best translated to "mystery" and is not limited to the seven ceremonies that are defined as "the sacraments:" baptism, confirmation, holy communion, penance, matrimony, ordination, and anointing of the sick. The traditional understanding of the Armenian Church, as testified by our church fathers, liturgical rite, theology, and canons, is that every liturgical service conducted by the church is a sacrament or mystery in the fullest sense of that term.





1957-1967: Served as a member of the Diocesan Council for Religious Education of New York City.

1957-1970: Served as the Pastor of St. Gregory the Illuminator Armenian Church, New York City.

August 31, 1964: Received permission by His Holiness, Vasken I, to wear a Pectoral Cross.

September 1970: Elected as the Pastor of St. Peter Armenian Church

of Watervliet, New York.

1971-1975: Served as member of the Diocesan Council, New York City.

1977: Received floral *Pilon* (Phelonion—Cope).

1984: Elevated to the rank of *Avak Kahana* (Senior Priest).

September 1989: Retired but continued to serve when and where needed.

June 27, 2013: Entered his eternal rest.


